

PlayStation Network Breach

Overview

- Took place between April 17th and April 19th, 2011
- Information of 77 million users was compromised
- 10 million of the above 77 million had credit card numbers associated with them
- Due to an "external intrusion" More on this later


Attack Timeline

- Tuesday, April 19th Sony learns that its PSN/Qriocity networks have been compromised, yet does not announce anything
- Wednesday, April 20th Sony closes down the two networks, yet does not disclose that the networks have been attacked
- Friday, April 22nd Sony reveals cause of the problems, an "external intrusion." Anonymous makes statement that it wasn't involved
- Monday, April 25th Sony confirms a breach of consumer data has occurred, withholds making announcement
- Tuesday, April 26th Sony releases most detailed statement of attacks + confirms that personal information was stolen

The attack

- Initial attack was disguised as a purchase, so no network security systems were alerted
- Launched from an application server that sits behind a web server + two firewalls on Sony's network
- Exploited a known vulnerability in application server to plant software that was used to access the database server, which sat behind the third firewall

The attack (cont.)



Information Stolen

- Name
- Address (city, state, zip)
- Country
- Email address
- Birthday
- PSN/Qriocity login + password [Encrypted via hash function]
- PSN online ID

- Profile Data, including
- Purchase history
- Billing address (city, state, zip)
- PSN/Qriocity password security answers
- Credit Card Data

 (number + expiration date) [Encrypted]

The aftermath: Sony's reaction

- Added automated software monitoring + configuration management, to help defend against new attacks
- Enhanced levels of data protection and encryption
- Enhanced ability to detect software intrusions within the network, unauthorized access and unusual activity patterns
- Implementation of additional firewalls
